

Trail Grooming:

Trails are groomed as conditions and staff allow, usually a couple times per week.

Tips For A Safe And Enjoyable Trip:

- The Kenai Nordic Trails are for non-motorized use only. Trails are groomed for both skating and classical skiing techniques. Please, no kick-sleds, snowbikes, running, walking or sledding on the groomed trails.
- Watch for grooming equipment. Not surprisingly, it has the right-of-way. Move well off the groomed trail to allow equipment to safely pass.
- Please do not bring pets or hike on groomed ski trails. Skijoring is allowed but dog(s) must be leashed at all times.
- Moose are common on the trail system. Please observe with caution and keep a safe distance at all times.
- If you fall, get clear of the trail and repair the damage. Do not stop where you obstruct the trail or are not visible.
- When approaching a slower skier with the intent to pass, shout "track" well in advance to alert the skier. The slower skier should step to the edge of trail.
- Always tell friends or family where you will be skiing.

Outdoor Ice Skating

Trail History:


Trail grooming efforts began in 1996 in order to enhance community recreation throughout the winter months. Shortly thereafter, Kenai Central High School and the Kenai Middle School offered Nordic skiing as an extra-curricular activity. Today, the department utilizes both a Ski-doo Skandic Widetrack and an Arctic Cat Bearcat. Equipment includes a roller/compactor, compaction drag and a small renovator. New to the fleet in 2013 is an 84" YTS Ginzugroomer with tracksetter.
